
Are all Homes the Same?

The Three Little Pigs


We will learn and retell the story of the Three Little Pigs before adapting the story to create our own version.

Gorgeous Gardens


By exploring the school garden we will name

We will find out about Beaches identifying different features of the beach, naming the seas that surround the UK and the five oceans.




Slip Slap Slop!

The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch The children will problem solve to make sure


Mr Grindling gets his lunch! Exploring simply pulleys will begin discussions on forces and why things move.




Colour Splash!
