

**Box CE VC Primary School
PE and Sports Grant**

The PE and Sports Grant was introduced in September 2013 and is additional government funding for schools to fund improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils so that they develop healthy lifestyles.

Allocations for the academic year 2015/16 are calculated using the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6, and those age 5 in Year R, as recorded on January 2015 Census, as follows:

- Schools with 17 or more pupils receive £8,000 plus £5 per eligible pupil; and
- Schools with 16 or fewer pupils receive £500 per eligible pupil.

Impact	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Changing the use of the pool area has created additional PE/Sports space and will further increase the amount and range of PE and sporting activities that can take place throughout the school day as well as morning break, lunch time, key stage one afternoon break and after school. For example break time activities now include a range of ball games, as well as games such as tag which can't be played on the playground due to the restricted space. • Coaching sessions ensure that specific skills and strategies are taught for less well known sports such as lacrosse and handball • Renewing the playtime equipment helps to ensure that the children are busy and as active as possible in a very restricted space at

break and lunch times.

- The lunchtime sports clubs enable children to develop the skills needed for the Corsham cluster tournaments and perform confidently in a competitive environment.
- Some tournaments take part during the school day and a supply teacher is needed to release a teacher to go to the competition with the children
